Spring – we can feel it in the air! The warmer weather is approaching and so are those mosquitoes and ticks. Spring is the signal that it is time for heartworm and tick-borne disease testing. When we take blood for your pet's heartworm and tick test (4dx test), we can also submit samples for wellness testing. Early detection of disease is the key to successful treatment. To help protect your pet against fleas, ticks and intestinal parasites topical

treatment or chewable tablets can be used. We can help you choose the best prevention for your pet.

### Brief update on ticks in Ontario

Ticks have established quite well in Ontario. We need to implement a preventative strategy against ticks. For those that love to do internet search –

http://www.capcvet.org/ is an excellent site for accurate detailed information about ticks and the diseases they transmit.

The ticks that we worry about in Ontario include

- 1) Brown Dog Tick lives in homes and kennels, can cause infestations.
- 2) American Dog Tick. This tick lives on our rabbits, raccoons, possums and squirrels. Therefore, these animals can bring ticks directly into your back yard.
- 3) Lonestar Tick. These ticks are a more aggressive tick as they "hunt" their host. They love to live in wooded areas.
- 4) The best known tick is the Deer tick that carries Lyme disease. This tick loves wooded areas to prevent drying out. The immature stages of this tick live on mice and migratory birds. They are active when outside temperature reaches 4C.
- 5) The diseases that this ticks can spread include; Anaplasmosis, Ehrlichisois, Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever, Rchettsiosis, and Lyme disease.


# Healthy Start Wellness Plan for Puppies and Kittens
